Serving as a member on our church board is one way that **Selby puts others' needs above his own.** This past year, the Congregation Council was considering adding a Paid Parental Leave policy for its staff. The original draft stated that a parent needed to take the leave immediately after a child's birth or adoption. Selby advocated to change the policy so staff members can take the leave within a reasonable time after a birth or adoption so that parents can stagger their leave and families can spend more time at home before going back to work. One of the pastors was very supportive of the idea as he recently had to take leave at the same time as his wife, limiting bonding time. Selby's advocacy led to the Council approving the policy change which now positively impacts the church staff. Your child will learn to stand up for others.

This past year Lego created a set themed to the Chinese New Year that depicts several families preparing to celebrate. We assembled the Legos while dinner was cooking but kept the box so that each year we can take it apart and rebuild it as another cherished tradition.

The State Fair is a highlight for us when it comes to town every fall. We enjoy seeing the prize winning animals and the giant vegetables that the local farmers were able to produce during the year, but no fair is complete without some fried food. Selby likes to read the news about what the latest craze the booths have come up with and makes a game plan for which foods he wants to try. This past year, a vendor came up with the idea of serving rattlesnake but we were not brave enough to give it a try. 


Values

The scientist was in a car crash and couldn't open the car door to save his wife, his strength failing him when he needed it most. This idea really resonated with Joshua and he used it as a mantra to help himself seek the help of a therapist. The path to resolving his anxiety took a lot of work and courage but whenever he felt overwhelmed, he reminded himself of the Hulk. A few years ago Joshua was able to meet Lou Ferrigno and thank him for what the show meant to him. Your child will know that it is important to take care of both your physical and mental health and that everyone needs help on occasion.





Working with the local Parks and Rec department, Boy Scouts, Toys for Tots, and Habitat for Humanity, among others, volunteering has always been a priority in our lives.
